Why Squirrels?

- Squirrels are symbols for
 - (extreme end of spectrum of) End-Users
 - extinction of innocent non-human species - an extreme consequence of Internet of Ecocide
 - Nature Fighting Back
- “Speaker For Squirrels”
 - similar to “Speaker for River” in “Fifth Sacred Thing”
 - similar to “Spekaer for the Dead” by Orson Scott Card
